Was there any authority at the LACC who investigated this area for the Health and Safety of Corps Members? Please provide the safety documents and/or liability waivers that corps members were given prior to their work at a former Nuclear and Rocket Engine Research Facility. This system was created to treat contaminated storm water runoff as per violations of the Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Boards National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System, not a walking garden as the interpretive pollinator signs and park benches would suggest. In the past work at this facility has been done by contractors who are trained to know the precautionary measures for Health and Safety while dealing with contaminated soils. Concerns were raised within the community when it was discovered that LACC members were on their hands and knees digging in this soil for planting.
